**Prison Me No Way Crime and Safety Awareness Day
Friday 1 May 2026**

We are writing to advise you that we will be staging a Crime and Safety Awareness Day (CSAD) provided by Prison! Me! No-Way! www.pmnw.co.uk to Year 8 on Friday 1 May 2026. The day will complement the National Curriculum Key Stages 3 & 4 rights and responsibilities of citizens and how the law and justice are applied alongside RSE and Health Education looking at healthy relationships, illegal substances, choices and the law. Students will also learn about the causes, consequences, and impact of crime upon them and their communities.

This full day interactive learning experience will feature a variety of sessions chosen from:

- county lines,
- anti-social behaviour,
- consequences of one punch,
- prison life,
- gun and knife crime,
- drugs and links to crime and irresponsible behaviour,
- young victims,
- domestic abuse,
- bullying, harassment and relationships,
- child sexual exploitation online and offline,
- consequences of social media misuse,
- grooming,
- railway trespassing
- first aid
- power station/line danger and much more.
