## WELCOME TO YEAR 11

Welcome to Year 11 GCSE English. We are really excited to see your progress this year and we are so proud of how hard you have already worked. You have proven that with determination and resilience you can achieve anything you set your mind to. This year is incredibly important, so we've put together some key information for you to refer to throughout the year.

### A FEW BITS FROM US:

In Year 11 students will take two English GCSEs: these are in Language and Literature. You may see these named Language C1 and Language C2. Our exam board is WJEC Eduqas.

### OUR EXAMS:

Language C1 = 5 reading questions and a narrative writing task  
Length: 1 hour and 45 minutes

Language C2 = 6 reading questions and two transactional writing tasks (articles, letters, speeches, reports, reviews, leaflets)  
Length: 2 hours

Literature C1 = 4 questions. Macbeth extract, Macbeth essay and single response to an anthology poem and comparison response  
Length: 2 hours

Literature C2 = 4 questions, A Christmas Carol essay, An Inspector Calls essay, Unseen poetry single response and unseen poetry comparison response.  
Length: 2 hours 30 minutes

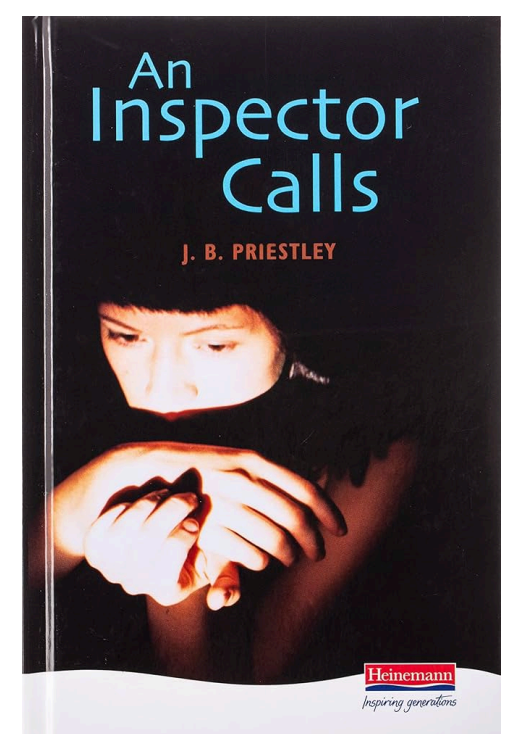
