Dear Parents and carers,

As part of this half term's diploma challenge, your child will become a WW2 evacuee for the day and experience life as it was in 1939. The idea behind the 'Outwood Living History' challenge will delve deeper into some of the key points children learnt as part of our World War 2 topic back in the spring term, where they learnt about the rights of the child during the war and how they lived in comparison to their own lives now.

We are asking children to become as fully immersed in this experience as possible and so we have designed many fun, creative and educational activities organised for this day. In order for students to take as much from this challenge as they can, we ask that your child dresses as a child from the 1940s for the day.

This will take place **week commencing 17th May**: an exact day within this week will be confirmed by your child's class teacher closer to this time.

Some ideas for ways to dress your child are listed below:

- All children should aim to wear shoes/boots/wellington boots (not trainers).
- A woollen jumper or cardigan.
- A shirt or a blouse.
- Boys could wear a cap or woollen hat and knee length trousers or smart shorts (cropped school trousers) if these are available to you.
- Girls could wear a woollen hat and a knee length dress or skirt if these are available to you.



Please note this is not an invitation for children to arrive at school in non-uniform on this day. If your child is not able to take part in the dressing up for the day please note this is not compulsory and that full school uniform must be worn instead.
