This week we have taken the opportunity to promote these important values and provide the children with a range of enhanced experiences through the Outwood Primary Diploma. Reception have looked at the book Handa's Surprise by Eileen Browne. They have looked at the world map and found the village she is from, experienced African crafts and dresses and looked at the different fruit from the story. Y1 are acknowledging the value of random acts of kindness in the community by decorating biscuits to give to a family member. Y2 have taken on the 'Hello' challenge, each day they have been learning a different greeting. Y3 have looked at compassion and learnt how to take care of a pet.
